# ROOTS OF THE NATIONAL INQUIRY

### THE MANDATE

 The National Inquiry must look into and report on the systemic causes of all forms of violence against Indigenous women and girls, including sexual violence. We must examine the underlying social, economic, cultural, institutional, and historical causes that contribute to the ongoing violence and particular vulnerabilities of Indigenous women and girls in Canada. The mandate also directs us to look into and report on existing institutional policies and practices to address violence, including those that are effective in reducing violence and increasing safety.

# FOUR ROOT CAUSES THAT MAINTAIN COLONIAL VIOLENCE



- Unresolved multigenerational and intergenerational trauma;
- Economic and social marginalization;
- Lack of political will and maintaining the status quo;
- Denial of the agency and expertise of Indigenous women and 2SLGBTQQIA+ people.

# THE PROBLEM WITH ARCHIVES...

Archives are about the power to remember, and the power to forget.

"Indigenous peoples to be central players in record keeping processes from the beginning. Their voices, aspirations, cultures and their value and knowledge systems must be respected and accommodated. The onus is on the institutions of archiving and record keeping to evolve in order to accommodate Indigenous peoples, rather than on Indigenous peoples to conform to mainstream practices."

## THE LEGACY ARCHIVE

- The Legacy Archive collected artistic expressions, either through donations (from family members of missing and murdered loved ones, intergenerational survivors and those working towards reconciliation), education projects or acquisitions from artists and storytellers.
- It is an ACTION-BASED project to empower new kinds of encounters, and new attitudes that support safety for Indigenous women, girls, and 2SLGBTQQIA+ People.



### **TELLING A NEW STORY**


- United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (Articles 8.1, 11.1, 12.1, 15.1, and 31.1)




