Workshop Description:

The Introduction to Oral History workshop will provide an overview of oral history as a research method and address the practical aspects of undertaking an oral history project. This special session for archivists will provide an overview of oral history as a research method, and will include how to: design an oral history project, budget enough time for your project, methods of interviewing, technical skills needed to make quality audio recordings, and how to create complementary text documents that help to ensure that your interviews will be archivable and accessible. This workshop will emphasize effective workflows and organization of born digital oral history records, and include strategies for assessing existent analogue collections that may be underutilized.

Presenter: Kimberley Moore

Kimberley Moore is the Programme Coordinator and Adjunct Professor at the Oral History Centre. She develops and coordinates the Centre's oral history workshops and assists in the development of the Oral History Centre's archive. She completed her Honours BA at the University of Winnipeg and her MA in History at Concordia University (Montreal), focusing on the practice and methods of oral history throughout. During her time at the Centre for Oral History and and Digital Storytelling (Concordia University), Kim worked as a Digital Projects Coordinator for the Montreal Life Stories Project assisting in the creation of a searchable database of video oral history interviews, and in doing so developed an interest in the methodological, ethical and technological challenges of preserving oral history interviews and creating accessible oral history interview collections.
